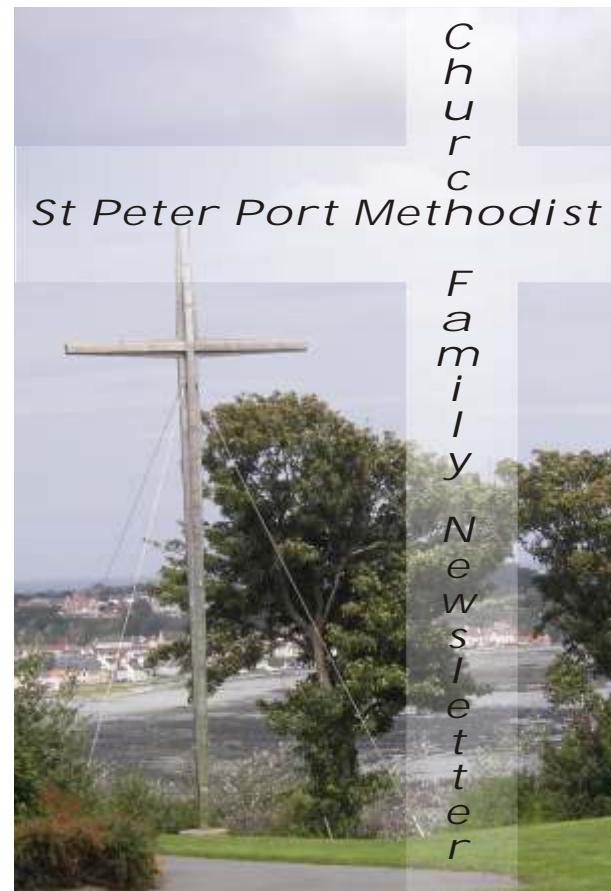


The minister was talking to a group of young children about being good and going to heaven. At the end of his talk he asked, "Where do you want to go?"
